Minutes of the Meeting

Before initiating the discussing on agenda, the Chairman introduced the external members and internal members to the Board. He also informed the members that the department of computer science is offering 6 programs in B.Sc (which includes M.P.Cs, M.S.Cs, M.G.Cs, G.G.Cs and B.Sc (IT), M.E.IoT), 1 program in B.Com (Computer Applications) and 1 program in B.A (E.S.CA). The Chairman also proposed new course structure aligned with the New Education Policy 2020, and the reforms put forth by Andhra Pradesh State Council for Higher Education. He also informed the committee that these reforms have been adopted by the Affiliating University Adikavi Nanayya University, Rajahmahendravaram. The board decided to introduce the following curriculum reform for the admitted batch 2020-21 all the 8 programs mentioned above. He initiated the discussion on the agenda points by presenting the Draft BoS book on the Screen.

It is resolved to approve the course structure with 163 credits distributed across all courses in 6 semesters for B.Sc programs.

Resolutions 2:

It is resolved to Introduce mandatory Community Project/Apprenticeship/on-job training/ Internship in phased manner. Every Student admitted in 2020-21 shall take up the First Phase of Community Project for 2 months during the 1st summer vacation, that is after completion of 2nd semester and before commencement of 3rd Semester and Second phase of Community Project/Apprenticeship/on-job training/ Internship for 2 months during the 2nd summer vacation that is after the completion of 4 th semester and before the commencement of 5 th Semester and Third Phase of Community Project/Apprenticeship/on-job training/ Internship



during 5 th semester or 6 th semester as per feasibility or in programme wise batches. First and Second Phases shall carry 4 credits and 100 marks each. And the third phase carries 12 credits and 200 marks.

Resolutions 3:

It is resolved to incorporate Life skills and Skill Development Courses in place of the Present Foundation courses with two credits each and 50 marks per course assessed through Semester End Examinations.
