RESOLUTION:

The Board of studies members have met in the department of Computer Science & Applications, Govt.College Autonomous, Rajamahendravaram and considered the enclosed agenda. After through deliberations and discussion, the Board members have resolved as follows.

1. The members formulated and approved the entire course structure of M.Sc. Computer Science
2. The members formulated and approved the syllabus, blue print and model papers for 1st and 2nd semesters of M.Sc. Computer Science on par with other Universities in the Country to be implemented from 2019-20 academic year.
3. The syllabus for practical for the above courses formulated on par with UGC model curriculum.
4. There shall be 4 to 6 hours per week for each theory paper and 3hours for each practical.
5. There will be 100 marks for each theory, 100 marks for each practical, 200 marks for project work and total marks for entire course is 2600. Total credits 108.

6. ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA FOR ADMISSION

The candidates for Admission into M.Sc. (CS) Programme shall have one of the following Qualifications.

Programme	Qualifications
M.Sc. (CS)	Mathematics as a course of study at 10+2 level; and (ii) Three year B.Sc. degree Programme with Mathematics and computer science / Three year B.C.A. degree Programme

7. It is resolved to implement student centric pedagogical strategies in teaching & learning.

8. Examination pattern will be as follow

A) Each theory subject is evaluated for 100 Marks out of which 60 marks for semester end Examination while the remaining 40 marks for continuous Internal assessment

which includes 5 marks for viva, 5 marks for Assignment and Presentation, 10 marks for pedagogical methods and 20 marks for Mid- Examinations. The minimum marks for qualifying in theory subject shall be 40% subject to securing minimum of 40% in the end examination.

B) The Semester End Examination question paper comprise of two section – section A & B, Section A consist of 4 essay questions one question from each unit of syllabus with internal choice ‘a’ or ‘b’. Section B consist of 8 short questions covers all units of the syllabus with internal choice to attempt only 5 out of 8 questions.

C) In practical 50 marks for each semester end examination and 50 marks for internal semester examination.
