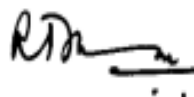

The syllabus is thoroughly discussed to include changes wherever necessary as per student feedback and also market requirements. The academic flexibility is used to include cross cutting issues in the curriculum. After detailed deliberations, the following resolutions are unanimously made.
